# The Christmas Market at Northcote Road - Sunday 1st December

Battersea's famous shopping street, renowned for being a haven of diversity and for its plethora of specialist shops, boutiques and restaurants, will host an additional 70 stalls offering a dizzy array of Christmas goodies, hot tasty street food, warming drinks and festive gifts this Sunday, 1st December in Northcote Road from 11am-5pm. This hugely popular pop-up Christmas Market, now in its seventh year, attracts hundreds of visitors and families with young children from the local and surrounding environs.
